

TREAT

If you suspect your horse is suffering from gastric ulcers, talk to your veterinarian about scheduling a gastroscopy exam.

If ulcers are diagnosed, strike back with GASTROGARD.



MANAGE

Continue to manage your horse's gastric health daily. In addition to minimizing stress, here are some helpful tips that can reduce your horse's risk of developing EGUS:

- Provide hay free-choice, utilizing a slow-feed hay net or feeder where possible.
- Consider adding alfalfa to their diet to help huffer acid.
- If concentrate is necessary, provide daily amount in frequent smaller meals, as opposed to twice per day in larger meals.
- · Feed hay before concentrate.

PREVENT

To avoid the occurrence of ulcers, identify and anticipate moments of stress, and talk to your veterinarian about the omeprazole dosing that will work best for your horse's needs.

This 12 year old Morgan gelding presented for behavioral changes, including bolting and bucking under saddle.



BEFORE: This horse was diagnosed with Grade II Equine Squamous Gastric Disease based on gastroscopy.
